




# Shakespeare's Macbeth in Seend 1st - 6th July, Cleeve House, Seend

## The Importance Of Being Earnest

Oscar Wilde's masterpiece performed in the glorious setting of West Lavington Manor and garden

First performed in 1895, 'The Importance of Being Earnest: A Trivial Comedy for Serious People' is widely regarded as one of the jewels of modern theatre. The script sparkles with witty one-liners and eminently quotable dialogue, and epitomises Wilde's mastery of paradox. The plot, revolving around a play on the name 'Ernest', is gloriously silly, and the characters utterly charming.

This production is a staged reading (meaning it will be performed with scripts in hand) and a promenade performance (meaning we will move from space to space and seating will be limited). ## **Gardening with Capability Charlotte**

## Slugging it out!

The slugs this year have been something else, haven't they? A combination of the mild winter and wet weather has brought them out in their thousands. They have decimated many of my plants, loving my soft, sandy soil.

But let's not hate them too much. Slugs and snails play a crucial role in our ecosystem. They help decompose organic matter, returning nutrients to the soil, and serve as a food

source for various predators. There are 40 different types of slug in the British Isles. Most of them are detritivores, preferring decaying matter to living plants - only nine cause damage. (Nine's enough!! Ed).

So how do we control these blighters? I could go through all the various deterrents but, to be honest, none of them are fail-safe. I've seen slugs use each other as a bridge to cross my very expensive copper slug rings! The best way is first to encourage their predators like beetles, frogs, toads and birds. It's a popular misconception that hedgehogs eat slugs - they will only eat them if they are desperate. Slugs are really bad for hedgehogs, as they have very little nutritional value and are carriers of lungworm parasites.

The other method is to go for plants they don't like: plants with toxic leaves, like foxgloves and euphorbia; spiky plants, like erigeron; succulent leaves like sedum and sempervivum, and hairy plants like hardy geraniums, stachys and alchemilla mollis. If you are trying to grow vegetables, try chard, celery, peas, chicory, endive and artichoke. Molluscs hate plants with a strong smell, such as onions and garlic. Surround your veg patch with aromatic bitter leaved plants, like lavender and thyme.

I personally collect slugs up at night and throw them into my compost heap!

## Local Roadworks in July, August and September

## **Lavington Lane**

There will be roadworks affecting Lavington Lane and The Spring, Market Lavington, from July 8th to August 30th, to install the long awaited Pelican crossing and new footpath, with traffic managed by lights.

From **9th to 13th September, Lavington Lane** will be closed from 7pm to plane off and resurface the existing carriageway.

#### **Cheverell Road**

Cheverell Road will be closed from the **West Lavington crossroads** on **21st July** between **0930 and 1530** to allow work by Openreach. It will also be closed between **29th and 31st July**, to allow Wessex Water to replace a faulty meter and do other works. Diversions will be in place.

Streetscene has created a herb planter at West Lavington Village Hall which is there for everyone to use, so if you need a herb for your cooking, help yourself!

Currently, the planter contains purple sage, fennel, rosemary, thyme, coriander, chives, nasturtiums, plus a bay tree and a curry plant!

'Works on the A<sub>3</sub>60 to install high-voltage cabling under the road continue to progress and are now in the final phase of trenching works between Druids Lodge and the Longbarrow roundabout. The project is still on schedule to be completed by mid-July. Wiltshire Council will also carry out additional improvement and maintenance works over the coming weeks, while the A<sub>3</sub>60 temporary closure is in place.'

## Struggling to survive - Otis Tarda

Some readers have asked where they might catch a glimpse of Crested tits and Bearded tits. You won't see them on your bird tables or feeders locally. You are unlikely to see the Crested tit anywhere in the British Isles, except in Scotland. The Spey Valley pine forests provided a sanctuary for them and they have now spread to Grampian and Sutherland. For Bearded tits, go to Titchfield Haven on the Hampshire Coast.

Marsh and Willow tits, difficult to tell apart, were garden visitors and used to enjoy the food in bird feeders. Coal tits too are in decline. On the positive side, it was pleasing to see families of Long-Tailed tits on feeders during the colder spells last winter.

Reports so far indicate that warbler populations are down again this year. Chiffchaffs were once pretty widely spread and were one of the first species to arrive. Not so this year, so far. Blackcaps and Garden Warblers – both beautiful songsters – have hardly been heard. Sedge, Reed, and Willow warblers and others formerly regularly seen on hedgerows, along water courses, in field hedgerows and woods, are in decline. For Dartford warblers, go to RSPB Arne Reserve in Dorset.

Enquiries have been made about Nightjars, having migrated 6,000 kilometres from Central Africa, but these are unlikely to be seen or heard locally. Nightjars fly silently and then suddenly start clapping their wings in display and making long drawn out churring noises on warm summer nights. Still, warm nights are perfect for seeing and hearing Nightjars – try Staple Hill in the Blackdowns, Staple Plain in the Quantocks, Stockhill on Mendip, or Webber's Post on Exmoor. Another migrant which may be mistaken for a Nightjar, though not of the same family, is the Wryneck, a species of the Woodpecker family. However, they are becoming very rare and you would be very lucky to see one. The writer has only seen a juvenile, in a semi rural Wiltshire garden in the 1970s.

Hirundinidae are also well down in numbers, and who has heard a cuckoo this spring? Migrant cuckoos will soon be on their flights back to Central Africa - you can track their progress on **www.bto.org/cuckoos** Anyone who is lucky enough to hear a nightingale, please post the info on your local FB page and inform your county ornithological website at **www.wiltshirebirds.co.uk** 

As reported in previous articles, there has been a dramatic decline in bird numbers and species since the 1970s. The BTO has further reported that between 2016 and 2021 UK bird species declined by 46%. 





## WEST LAVINGTON PARISH COUNCIL



I'll start with the news that we have a vacancy on the Parish Council. The role of Councillor is voluntary, our job is to protect and enhance our village and our community. We represent the views and concerns of residents of the Parish to Wiltshire Council and the Parish Council itself. We have one formal meeting per month - between meetings you can get involved with as much or as little as you want. The sun came out this week and Dorset & Wiltshire Fire Service have issued an Amber Wildfire Alert. I'm sure we are all raising our collective eyebrows, but if like me you are a big user of Salisbury Plain you will know how quickly the grasslands dry out. Please take care around the village and while out and about with cigarettes, BBQ's and garden bonfires.

Following one of the wettest winters on record, there has been an increase in flooding incidents around the county. While some of these cannot be prevented following the huge volume of rain we have faced, many flooding incidents on highways and other areas can be prevented with good maintenance from the landowner. Most ditches and minor watercourses in Wiltshire are the responsibility of the 'riparian landowner', which is the person who owns the land on either side of the watercourse. The landowner has both the rights and responsibilities for the ditches, or other watercourses flowing through or alongside their property. Please be aware of your responsibilities!

This month the Parish Council's Footpath group has been out with Market Lavington's group to look at footpaths that connect our two Parishes at the northern end of the village. They were working with landowners and Dauntsey's School to see how access and safety can be improved around the Sunken Lane, the connecting footpath that runs between Russell Mill Lane and Market Lavington.

Our footpaths team has a new direct email address at **footpaths@westlavington.org.uk** where residents can report any issues with rights of way in and around the village. We would also like to remind residents to watch for hedge growth through the summer and to cut back hedges and garden growth to keep rights of way clear.

We have noticed a few instances of garden waste, grass and hedge cuttings being taken through back gates and dropped on land adjacent to footpaths. Be aware this is Fly Tipping and will

be reported as such by the Parish Council. Fly Tipping is illegal and fines are large. Please use council provided green bins or take garden waste to Wiltshire Council recycling centres and dispose of it properly. Garden waste does rot down but piles of it on farmers' fields and woods is not good for the environment and spoils our footpaths.

The next PC meeting is on **Wednesday July 3rd at 7pm** in the Giles Room, West Lavington Village Hall. Members of the public are welcome to attend. There is no meeting in August.

It remains for all of us at the Parish Council to wish everyone a wonderful summer, and enjoy your holidays. We hope to see you at the **Village Fete on Saturday July 6th.**

# WEST LAVINGTON & LITTLE CHEVERELL BOOK CLUB



Our theme for June was a book made into a film, listed in historical order:

American Civil War: Gone with the Wind by Margaret Mitchell. A wonderful sweeping epic novel set in the American South and a great film faithful to the book.

**19th Century Paris: Les Miserables by Victor Hugo.** An escaped convict tries to escape his past. A great story which has been made into a film, musical and stage play!

**Early 20th century: The 39 Steps by John Buchan.** A classic spy thriller, selected as one of the 100 best novels in English. Numerous adaptations for film, television and stage.

**World War One: The African Queen by C.S. Forester.** Missionary Rose Sayer and Charles Allnutt become allies as, marooned in German Central Africa during World War I, they fight their old launch The African Queen downriver 'to strike a blow for England'. Classic film starring Humphrey Bogart and Katharine Hepburn.

**WWII** - **Dunkirk** - **The History behind the Major Motion picture by Josh Levine**. A dramatic account of the famous defeat told from the viewpoints of land, sea and air.

**WWII** - **The Book Thief by Marcus Zusak:** By her brother's graveside, Liesel's life is changed forever when she picks up a single object, abandoned in the snow. The Gravedigger's Handbook is her first act of book thievery. A good film, but the book is better!

**WWII** - **All the Light We Cannot See by Anthony Doerr:** a beautiful novel about a blind French girl and a young German radio operator whose paths collide in occupied France – great book, bad film., OK TV series.

**WWII** - **The English Patient by Michael Ondaatje:** as the final curtain is closing on the Second World War, Hana, a nurse, tends to her sole remaining patient in an abandoned Italian villa. Rescued from a burning plane, the anonymous Englishman is damaged beyond recognition and haunted by painful memories. Great book and film.

**1930s:** The Color Purple by Alice Walker. Taking place mostly in rural Georgia, the story focuses on the life of women of colour in the southern United States in the 1930s. Good film.

**1960s: The Comedians by Graham Greene.** Set in Haiti under the rule of Papa Doc Duvalier and his secret police, the novel explores political repression and terrorism through the figure of an English hotel owner. Great film starring Richard Burton and Elizabeth Taylor.

**Contemporary - Life of Pi by Yann Martel:** After a cargo ship sinks in the middle of the vast Pacific Ocean, there are five survivors stranded on a lifeboat - a hyena, a zebra, an orangutan, a Royal Bengal tiger, and a sixteen year-old boy named Pi. Who will survive? Good film, also a stage play.

**Contemporary - The Hobbit by J R R Tolkien:** written in the 1930s but not filmed until 2012, the classic tale set in Middle Earth and the prequel to the Lord of the Rings trilogy. A brilliant short book, definitely not worth three films!


# LAVINGTON PRE-SCHOOL

#### **Patience**

'We also have joy with our troubles, because we know that these troubles produce patience. And patience produces character and character produces hope. And this hope will never disappoint us, because God has poured out His love to fill our hearts.' (Romans 5:3-5)

We need to exercise patience in our lives, however God didn't give us the gift of patience at birth. We need to develop patience

as it is a very powerful aspect of a Christian life. So how do we develop patience in our lives? Difficulties that we face are opportunities in disguise given to us in order to develop patience.

When we hit a problem we say: "God what is happening to me? Why couldn't this problem be resolved? Lord what is going on here? Why didn't you answer my prayer? I don't deserve this, why did you allow it to happen?" We forget God's purpose in our life is not to give us ease and pleasure, His purpose in this life is to grow us up, to mature us. He predestined, preplanned before hand that every one of His children, every saved person would be conformed to the likeness of His Son.

## **Parking at Salisbury Station**

## Temporary parking loss due to improvement works

Extensive improvement works have begun on the forecourt at Salisbury Station to create a more welcoming first impression to the city and be more accessible for visitors and residents. The £5.8 million scheme will take approximately one year to complete with continuous access to and from the station throughout the works. The redevelopment will result in the temporary loss of all **standard pay and display parking on the forecourt** for the duration of the works.

The parking at the western end of the car park will remain open, together with the drop-off point and 20-minute spaces at the station entrance/exit.

Blue badge parking will still be available on the station forecourt and will be throughout the improvement works.

Alternative parking will be temporarily available at Central Car Park, approximately a seven minute walk away. Existing short-stay parking is being changed to long-stay parking to support rail customers, until the new temporary station car park on Fisherton Street, next to the Royal Mail Salisbury Delivery Office, is opened later this year.

As the project progresses, the locations of the station's taxi rank, bus stop, pick up/drop off area and blue badge parking will change, so check with South West Trains for updates.

Readers might wish to consider travelling from Andover or Grateley stations instead.


