

#### **REFLECTION**

During this season in our Benefice without a rector, different church members are delighted to share a monthly reflection with you. This month it is written by Peter Carr who is a Lay Worship Leader and member of the congregation in Great Cheverell.

St. Peter was originally named Simon, and was a member of a group of Galilean fishermen some of whom were called to the faith by Jesus. Simon was a powerful and extrovert character, and Jesus gave him the name 'Peter' meaning 'rock', saying symbolically "on this

rock I will build my church". A defining moment for Peter, and identifying him as a corner-stone of the early Christian movement.

As leader of the disciples, he witnessed many of the key moments of Jesus's ministry, including the transfiguration and the agony of Gethsemane. Peter is best known for his deep, though sometimes faltering faith – he famously denied knowing Jesus three times in Gethsemane – during events leading up to the crucifixion. Peter was also impetuous but, despite the odd human weakness, he demonstrated an extraordinarily deep faith.

After the resurrection, he was forgiven and restored by Jesus who instructed him to "feed my sheep", importantly commissioning him as leader of the early church. In doing so, Peter preached boldly and travelled widely performing healings and conversions, and helped to establish the church in Jerusalem and beyond. His travels ended with his martyrdom in Rome, where he was arrested, condemned to death by Emperor Nero, and crucified.

Our church of St. Peter's, Great Cheverell, reflects his legacy of faith and perseverance, and serves as a place of worship and community. His story of doubt, redemption and ultimate deep devotion resonates with all Christians making him a fitting Patron for this place of faith and worship.

We shall be celebrating St. Peter with a Flower Festival over the weekend of 28th/29th June, as well as a Teddy Bear Zip Wire Event on the Saturday and a Patronal service at 10.30am on the Sunday. All are welcome.

Betty always made a positive and cheerful impression wherever she went, often giving out bars of chocolate in appreciation of any help she received, which always brought a smile to the surprised recipient. Her stoic attitude to coping with her significant health issues were worthy of the highest accolade and particular gratitude must go to the team at Courtyard Surgery and Nunton Ward at Salisbury Hospital, and in particular her compassionate haematologist Dr Louise Gamble, for their excellent care, enabling her to live the fullest life she did. The many lovely heartfelt messages received from friends and people that knew her brought

much comfort to those that simply just chose to lovingly care and help her in any way they could and be a part of her daily life.

We have arranged for a bench in fondest memory of Betty to be placed in Roberts Playground, West Lavington. United as promised with her beloved and sadly departed only daughter Beverley Yates, and accompanying the existing bench she previously gave in dedication of George Light, who was her faithful and much-cherished companion for many years. We are hoping to have a gathering of friends once it is safely installed to remember this remarkable and very special lady and any that wish to be involved are welcome to attend. #### May in the Garden - and the magic of Hawthorn

May is a glorious month in the garden — full of promise, colour, and life. With longer days and rising warmth, there's plenty to do: sow tender annuals, plant out dahlias, and hoe weeds before they set seed. Slugs and snails are particularly active now, so protect young plants. And while the lawnmower may be calling, consider joining the **No Mow May** movement — and leave a small part of your lawn uncut to support bees and other pollinators.

Beyond the jobs list, May brings the hawthorn (Crataegus monogyna) into bloom. This spiny native tree froths through the hedgerows with creamy white flowers and a musky, unforgettable scent. Beloved by bees and steeped in folklore, hawthorn is the true tree of May — and likely the root of the old saying, 'Ne'er cast a clout till May is out.' The phrase warns not to shed your warm layers until the hawthorn blossom is out



- not just the month - a nod to the unpredictability of British spring.

In folklore, hawthorn was sacred to the fairy realm, marking thresholds, crossroads, and wells. A lone tree was often a fairy tree, never to be cut, and bringing blossom indoors was said to invite misfortune. It was also a symbol of fertility and protection, central to May Day celebrations. So when you have tended to your garden, take a walk up Strawberry Hill, find some hawthorn: breathe in its wild scent and honour its magic.

Trymnells, 1a Coxhill Lane, Potterne, Devizes, SN10 5PH. 12 - 5pm, Adm £5.

Trymnells garden was started eight years ago. It is now maturing and has many trees, shrubs, hedges and perennials. The garden is steep and slopes up from the property and reaches a steep bank at the very top. Sleepers, fences, walls and plants have imposed a sense of structure with bulbs and perennials providing wonderful colour. Parking at Potterne Village Hall, some space on drive for those with limited mobility.

#### Saturday 31st:

**Eastwell Manor, Eastwell Road, Potterne, Devizes, SN10 5QG.**1.30 - 5pm Adm £8 Eastwell Manor was built by the family in 1570 and is representative of a small manorial estate with its own brew house, granary and stables. The garden, based on terraces, features a banqueting house against a backdrop of woodland, with wonderful views to Salisbury Plain

over water. Eastwell boasts various specialist trees and mature palms. There are uneven steps and limited wheelchair access. Homemade teas in aid of St Mary's Church, Potterne.

Conock Manor, Conock, Devizes, SN10 3QQ. 11am - 4pm. Adm £8. A relaxed family garden embracing C18 architecture and defined by its long, south facing wall. There are lawns and wildflower meadows, mixed borders and climbers, a magnolia grove and a vegetable garden with greenhouse. The garden utilises a ha-ha to sit comfortably in the surrounding wooded parkland with views out to the surrounding hills and the Alton Barnes chalk-horse. Soft lawn, some gravel paths. Teas, coffee,cold drinks, cakes & pastries.

# Mothers'J N

The Mothers' Union has continued to meet over the last two months. On 10th March we were delighted to welcome our speaker for the afternoon, Anna Spear, who spoke on the topic of 'Dementia and The Church'.

Anna's career began as a general nurse, and this broadened into the dementia field when she worked with families in our local area. She then became a Dementia Trainer. Anna explained the meaning of the different types of dementia. It is a progressive condition in which the brain cells die more quickly than happens with the normal ageing process. This results with the person struggling to remember things like names and dates and becoming confused. This then leads to difficulties with communication, as well as with mobility and perception. The four needs to be addressed in a person with dementia are physical, emotional, social, spiritual and attending church fits all these. People with dementia rely heavily on their family and friends and some will also need their Church Family.

We read daily of animals and birds driven to extinction, but here's one of the extinct species which could be regenerated. It's 10,000 years since there were woolly mammoths here on Planet Earth, but scientists in the US are working towards bringing it back from extinction. They have engineered mice to grow thick, warm coats by using DNA from mammoths remains. The future aim is to use this technique on elephants so that they become woolly mammoths.

Elephants in a California wildlife park demonstrated their remarkable intelligence recently. They can detect early warnings of earthquakes through their feet, and' during the 5.2 magnitude earthquake that shook Southern California last month, formed what is known as an 'alert circle' scrambling to protect their calves by surrounding them. In central Africa, 95% of the elephant population is slaughtered for their ivory. Their near extinction alters the whole eco system of the area. Nature must be allowed to restore its own balance and we must ensure that we assist Nature to survive and restore and nurture these fine balances. Another excellent series currently on BBC TV is 'The Americas' (both North and South), narrated by Tom Hanks, which demonstrates the fragile balances in the different eco systems.



Those readers who bought the Royal Mail's special Wildlife stamp issue will recognise how much of nature is around us and in our own gardens to enjoy. Now is the time that nestlings are becoming fledglings and are at their most vulnerable to predators, especially from corvids, grey squirrels, raptors and our own domestic moggies. Please do all you can to ensure that nestlings and fledglings are protected, the latter until they have learned to fly. Please also remember to keep your feeding stations and bird baths scrupulously clean because there is still avian flu about. Also, as reported in earlier years, be aware, especially if you are a bee keeper, that Asian hornets are now more prevalent. You can report sightings via the Asian Hornet app. Let us ensure our own habitats are safe for nurturing nature. On a visit to the Lake District last month the Princess of Wales told scouts of the healing benefits of Nature describing how she had found a very spiritual and very intense reconnection with nature.






# Parish Magazine

This picture from the front cover shows that Parish of Market Lavington was previously known as Bishop's Lavington. Clearly, the populous were quite religious, with an average of four services on each Sunday.

Some of the most interesting items are the advertisements. Those of you born in the villages,

will possibly remember some of these businesses - let us know.

You will notice that the magazine cost  $1\frac{1}{2}p$  - a bargain, *or not*? In today's money that would be 36p. However, the average weekly wage then was £22.51, so it would be quite an outlay at 6.6% of their wages. I'm sure there will be someone who will prove my calculations wrong! An interesting read.


